the year is 1948 the place samakh a small town on lake tiberias north of jerusalem people in samakh are waiting for what exactly they do not yet know the whistle of the haifa deraa train doesn't sound anymore abd al karim the shopkeeper no longer goes into the city to buy new stock you townspeople says haj mahmoud leader of the fighters in the 1936 rebellion had better start digging trenches there are dark days ahead a lake beyond the wind is a novel about the most catastrophic year in palestinian history a time marked by violent clashes between zionist forces and the volunteers of the arab liberation army yakhlif tenderly gathers all the town folk the soldiers of the beleaguered army the animals of the natural world into his tale which makes it all the more powerful a lament for a world that is no more

national bestseller a thrilling odyssey through an unforgiving landscape from canada's greatest living explorer in the spring of 2017 adam shoalts bestselling author and adventurer set off on an unprecedented solo journey across north america's greatest wilderness a place where in our increasingly interconnected digital world it's still possible to wander for months without crossing a single road or even see another human being between his starting point in eagle plains yukon territory to his destination in baker lake nunavut lies a maze of obstacles shifting ice floes swollen rivers fog bound lakes and gale force storms and shoalts must time his departure by the breakup of the spring ice then sprint across nearly 4 000 kilometers of rugged wild terrain to arrive before winter closes in he travels alone up raging rivers that only the most expert white water canoeists dare travel even downstream he must portage across fields of jagged rocks that stretch to the horizon and navigate labyrinths of swamps tormented by clouds of mosquitoes every step of the way and the race against the calendar means that he cannot afford the luxuries of rest or of making mistakes shoalts must trek tirelessly well into the endless arctic summer nights at times not even pausing to eat but his reward is the adventure of a lifetime heart stopping wonder filled and attentive to the majesty of the natural world beyond the trees captures the ache for adventure that afflicts us all

an exciting foray into earth's inland waters the remarkable species they contain and the conservation challenges of protecting them when we call earth the blue planet we immediately envision the vast oceans that cover most of its surface but seas aren't the only bodies of water that make earth special millions of diverse inland waters rush meander and seep throughout the planet teeming with life these streams lakes wetlands and groundwaters are home to thousands of species many of which are extraordinary and some of which are critically endangered in beyond the sea ecologist david strayer introduces readers to the world's most remarkable and varied inland waters including massive lakes that fill only once a century groundwaters miles beneath our feet that host unique microbes volcanic lakes more corrosive than battery acid and catastrophic floods that carry ten times more water than the amazon river strayer also shares stories of the myriad fascinating species supported by these crucial ecosystems featuring mussels that seduce fish tiny tardigrades that cheat death animals that photosynthesize and plants that eat meat because humans have used and abused inland waters so intensively for everything from drinking water and fly fishing to sewage disposal many species around the world that depend on them are in desperate peril strayer explains the damage that humans have caused and offers solutions to sustain and restore inland water ecosystems proving that the sea isn't the only aqueous realm of mystery and wonder this book illuminates the secrets science and amazing denizens of the overlooked waters in our backyards

the first book to document the maritime history of the port city muskegon combining historical detail and good storytelling beyond the windswept dunes takes the reader into a world of maritime adventure as it was experienced by the sailors passengers rescue workers shipping magnates industrialists and many other people whose livelihoods revolved around michigan s port city of muskegon at one time the leading edge of westward expansion muskegon was a place where lumbering and lakers merged and where rails met decks a place situated midway along the coast of a great and sometimes stormy inland sea here elizabeth sherman offers both a shipping history and a portrait of the city the events covered range from the visit by the british sloop h m s felicity in 1779 through muskegon s boom years as lumber queen of the world from the city s revitalization with the opening of the st lawrence seaway to its recent establishment of a floating museum complex for historic naval vessels the book s focus is on the ships themselves such as the lyman m davis salvor highway 16 and milwaukee clipper vessels that were noteworthy for being the first of their kind or for their popularity unusual and distinctive careers or tragic losses a number of ships were lost in lake michigan near muskegon harbor and the stories of some of the most notable wrecks and rescue missions appear in this book including the psychic intervention that led the william nelson to the exciting rescue of the crew aboard the sinking our son the book offers many first hand statements of shipwreck survivors and other witnesses lending an authentic voice to the accounts

business career reflected and contributed to african economic advancement firmly rooted in a rejection of racialism even in its heartland of big european dominated business he applied his business ideals in pursuing indigenous technical and business training in copper mining in zaire now the democratic republic of the congo followed by assignments in morocco and mauritius a brief interlude and a return to african politics came when he helped to supervise the elections following the lancaster house agreement which brought robert mugabe to power in zimbabwe but his most lasting contribution to africa came with the mining giant rio tinto and his ground breaking scheme for training indigenous technical managers these rose to the highest positions and broke the mould of european managerial and technical dominance his promotion of african business continued in his role as africa director of the british executive service overseas beso and as director of the royal african society and consultant to the west african business association waba and the southern african business forum sabf beyond the malachite hills is a remarkable testament to his long lasting and profound involvement with this often misunderstood continent
